The Golden Age of Trucking Museum is designed to accommodate children of all ages. Please reserve a date for your school group to visit us. We are available for school groups daily from 10 a.m. until 4 p.m.

Interactive Interstate

This area of the museum is “hands-on” for the children

There are books, games, puzzles, easels, a blackboard, blocks, legos, computers, a TV with videos, ride-on toys, a playhouse, dolls...

There is also a cut-away of a Volvo tractor with a sleeper that the children can get into on their own.

Memory Lane

A display of antique and collectible toys and “Crosley” antique cars and memorabilia.

Media on West Main

A media room where “Moving History” a thirty-five minute movie is shown. It is the story of moving the Edaville Railroad from Carver, Massachusetts to Portland, Maine. Some of the antique trucks that are now in the museum were used during the move which took place in 1993. We also have a collection of children’s videos that you may choose to watch that may be more age appropriate.

Founder’s Gallery

An art gallery with changing exhibits. The current exhibit is “Trucks and More...” featuring the watercolors of artist Howard Shoemaker of Guilford, CT.

Waramaug Way

An indoor picnic area with two antique boats, fishing memorabilia, vanity license plates, and trucking hats which have been donated by our many visitors.

This area may accommodate the children for a snack or lunch. There is a place for the children to hang their coats and backpacks or lunches here.

Showroom

The main show room is home to over 30 antique vehicles, photographs and memorabilia. The trucks represented include Dodge, Mack, GMC, Ford, International, Autocar, White, Kenworth, Diamond T, Jeep, Pierce Arrow, Republic and more. They range from the early 1900's through the 1970's. Each exhibit features a short narrative about the vehicle.

Library Lane

An informal reading lounge with transportation related reading materials.

Gift Shop

There is a gift shop with an assortment of T-shirts(\$10. and up), baseball caps(\$17.), sweatshirts(\$20.) toys(\$2. and up), puzzles(\$4.99 and up), stuffed animals(\$5. and up), toy cars and trucks(\$2. and up), books(\$2.99 and up), post cards(.75), and novelty gifts(.50 and up) and snacks(.25 and up).

The museum is self-guided. We do have volunteers available for questions during group visits. We are handicap accessible.

School rates are \$5. for adults and \$4. for students.
